












Dear supporters and friends,

Dear friends,

I have had mixed feelings about the one-year anniversary of John's heart event. It seems like I have marked the event in so many different ways over the past year, noting the 29th of each month that passed, and wondering how he would do on his first flight and first illness. We learned that the bones in his chest would likely hurt with each weather change and particularly when it was cold. We both are still learning to deal with a measure of uncertainty and anxiety, while at the same time refusing to live in fear. It has certainly been a journey of faith—one that I have

learned doesn't have an "end" in this life, but is ongoing. I am so thankful to have him here.

The photos on the first page are a sort of recap of 2021. During January, John was recovering and our home was in a state of complete chaos due to the septic issue we had while he was in the hospital. That led to a lot of home repairs that were long overdue - it was simply the worst timing, but God even cared for us in this regard, because insurance covered much of it. February was the once-in-a-lifetime ice storm in Texas that we managed to miss by just a few hours as we left for Denver! I was able to finish teaching my women's class in person. In March, we organized quite a few outdoor devotionals in Denver because meeting with the church was so challenging with Covid restrictions. The weather in April was beautiful on a weekend when we gathered with many of the BV students for a marriage seminar. In May, we traveled to Alaska for a gospel meeting/marriage seminar, and stopped back in Denver for Bear Valley's graduation exercises. In June, John spent a lot of time working at WVBS on the new "Connections" series. In July, we held a marriage seminar at the Gabriel Oaks congregation in Georgetown, TX. August held the beginning of the fall quarter with Bear Valley - most of the faculty and staff are pictured. In September, the Denver staff and many of the extension school staff gathered for the annual retreat and Denny Petrillo's "State of the Union" address. In October, we traveled quite a bit, including a trip to West Virginia for the WVSOP lectureship. While there, we visited Bethany, where so many of the restoration era locations are. In November, I spoke to a women's group in Malaysia (the Kota Kemuning congregation) via Zoom on the topic of "resilience" - it was such a true joy to see these sweet faces again, as I grew to love them when we visited in 2018. And during December, so much of my time was spent completing the 2022 Scripture Writing file (available on my blog here - https://
