Dear supporters and friends,

"Oh I see now, the Old Testament is sort of like a long story about a family," said a prospect during a Bible study I conducted this past month. During the month of April, I was blessed to conduct several Bible studies with two college-age men who work in the Dripping Springs community. Dylan was attending worship because of Denny Williamson, one of the individuals who administered CPR to me on November 29, 2020. In turn, Dylan invited his friend Tanner, and on April 19th both of these sincere and dedicated young men were baptized into Christ. Dylan's statement about the Old Testament could not have been more accurate, especially when we consider the New Testament story of the family of Christ to which he and Tanner both now belong. Indeed the family of God is a blessing, and we are privileged to see how, through the grace of God, souls are being added to the church, and how many more are continuing to write other stories of faith similar to those found in scripture. Just like Abraham, Sarah, Peter, Paul, Phoebe, and so many others of the biblical world, many today are walking with God through the path of life and finding strength in God's marvelous family. To see God's family grow and develop has been extremely rewarding. Whether at the Bear Valley Bible Institute, or at a teacher workshop and lecture series in Kentucky, or from news we receive from viewers of the Bible Land Passage videos, listeners to the Looking Up podcast, or participants in the Scripture writing ministry, we are thrilled to hear the *modern* day stories of God's wonderful family.

One of those modern day stories of faith has come to us from one of our latest trips to Israel, where we were blessed to guide 37 souls through some of the most well-known and beloved sites of the Bible Lands. While we always try to learn more for instructional and filmmaking purposes about each of the sites we visit, by far the most rewarding part of our BLP ministry involves the people. Witnessing the reaction and the "ah ha" moments of travelers is joyous. When participants begin to understand the connections between what they read in scripture and what they experience in Israel, it forever adds to the way they read the Bible and will draw them closer to God. An example of this can be seen in one of the commendations we received from one of our most recent Bible Land Passage participants. 

the devotional there. I think you never know what's going to touch you and those moments really can't be anticipated. They just happen. Our family had a very rough 2021-2022 with some horrible things that happened to a family member. It rocked my faith in a big way. We spent a year and a half pulling our child out of the wreckage, scrambling to come to terms with our faith in this wicked world. I couldn't even say "God is good" for about a year. It made my chest hurt to say it. Our child is doing much, much better now!! But, my faith, and my daily walk, has been changed. I wish I could go back to the way it was, and maybe that will still happen one day. But right now, I'm the blind man that was sent to the pool of Siloam, walking with faith, not quite knowing what's going to happen, how things are going to happen, but believing Jesus will work it all out for good. I loved all the stops we made on the trip. But my faith is

still wounded and hurting, and it was at that pool—the way you told that story—that made me think—It's okay that my faith isn't perfect. It's okay and enough to blindly follow Jesus. Just keep following, keep believing, keep hoping. Anyhow, that's just where I'm at. An odd place in my walk. Thank you for illuminating that story in that way. I've never thought about the details of that blind man story in that way. I certainly never thought of myself as the blind man... Thank you for that story, and for everything you and Carla did on that trip!! We appreciate you!"

As you can see, it's this kind of testimony that encourages us to keep on organizing these kinds of trips to the Bible lands. We enjoy all the components of our ministry at Bible Passages, and trips to the Bible Lands are no different. Witnessing firsthand the impact this program has on fortifying the faith of the followers of Jesus is exciting. We like to say that this program isn't at all a vacation; it's a "church retreat on steroids". Throughout every day, we are in the word, discussing scripture, praying, singing, and encouraging one another in our Christian walk. Because of you and your support, we can conduct devotionals, deliver lectures, and gather film data and information for use in the Bible land documentaries and videos, and can likewise God can change lives and prepare souls for eternity. Thank you so much for all you do to make the work of both Bible Passages and Bible Land Passages possible. We appreciate so very, very
