With a record number of students enrolled at Bear Valley, and with their varied backgrounds and nationalities, I am confident that many souls will be saved by the efforts of their respective works following their graduation. 



Carla has been very busy as well with writing for Christian Woman magazine, teaching a class in the women's program at Bear Valley, and keeping a lot of the students happy with occasional afternoon Pizza Roll breaks, and with a monthly birthday lunch celebration. One other item of work this month has involved the planning and development of the 2020 Bible Lands Studies program; one for Bear Valley Bible Institute and the other as one of our general programs. Yesterday at Bear Valley, the young ladies gave a tea and devotional for all of the women, and the young men conducted worship services. They are called "God's Precious Daughters" and "Young Lions". I wasn't able to be at the tea, but loved listening to the young men during worship. Of course they were all as cute as a button, with adorable lisps, cowlicks, and bowties, clambering up onto a stool to make them tall enough to see over the pulpit, then staring like deer in the headlights when they saw the entire congregation looking back at them. They all had excellent things to say, but one young man named Eli Woolley said something that immediately made my eyes well up with tears. He was praying, and he said this to God: "Psalm 119:105 says Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. That means if we fall off Your footsteps You will help us get back in them." What a beautiful way to see God!



We were able to catch a quick 20 hours with the babies and Jordan and Erin - we met them in southern Colorado.

The word illuminates the path that God wants us to be on, but Eli knew - and helped us to see - that God is willing to, and *wants* to help us when we fall down. I hope I never forget the way Eli said it.
