












Carla's Comments

(I shared the following on social media after Grady passed away and wanted to share my thoughts here as well.)

As many of you know, my father in law, Grady Thomas Moore, left this present world late Thursday night, May 21, 2020. On Tuesday, May 26, we laid his body to rest. I've known him for 36 years. His quiet, remarkable (and I don't use that word lightly) life forever altered the course of my life. Because of who he was and how he lived and how he and Janice shaped and molded and influenced John, my life has been abundantly blessed beyond all I could ask or think. His life continues to shape the lives of my sons, who adored him. The ripple effect of this man's character, integrity, humor, common sense, fair-mindedness, wisdom and foresight will be eternal.

I loved him so. He and Janice extended abundant kindness to my parents. He loved reliving the past and telling stories (over and over...and over) and he loved laughter. He and Janice did not offer advice unless we asked for it (and there is no doubt we should have asked for his wisdom more.) How often did he sit beside someone in the bleachers while he watched our boys playing some sport – and make friends with the stranger next to him? He looked toward the future and prepared for things I'd never even imagined. He also looked to the past and wanted us to remember it and learn from it. He would often ask me to type things that he'd written out, and he couldn't spell to save his life, but let me tell you – his wisdom and intelligence far, FAR exceeded many who have been highly educated. He was an elder—a faithful and true shepherd who indeed shepherded, tended, paid attention to, fed, and loved the Dripping Springs sheep for more than forty years.

Last week when we got word that hospice was sending a hospital bed, we rushed around, cleaning out the breakfast nook in preparation for its delivery. We swept and washed the windows and moved furniture around. During all of the hubbub and activity, while he waited and slept in his

recliner. I had the strangest flashback to the delivery room when John and I had our babies. I remember as birth was imminent, the nurses whisked around, quickly breaking down the bed, draping and cleaning things to get ready for the baby's arrival. That day last week felt so similar, yet so different at the same time. We were preparing him for his exit from this world and I wondered what exactly he would see as he emerged on the other side. There was joy, but there was pain, too. We struggle as we enter and as we exit. First breaths and last breaths. I felt sorry for my newborn babies as they exited the warm, safe, peaceful environment God designed for them and entered into this cold, bright, painful world. But there was no sorrow—for him —as he left the painful world behind and entered into the perfect, peace-filled bright light of God's glory. We gathered as his heart slowed and stopped, and Janice held his hand as angels came to carry him to the presence of the Lord. What a beautiful gift, and a beautiful life well lived. I thank God for the blessing of my dear father-in-law, Grady Moore.
