

We are so blessed to have 29 full-time students enrolled in our Denver program who are all preparing themselves to work in various capacities of ministry. encouraging events of the year. When we hear the life stories of students in both Denver and abroad, we are always so impressed and thankful to see God working in the lives of so many different people all over the world.





Covid didn't keep us from staying busy! John never missed a beat, teaching his classes via Zoom even on the one day he didn't feel very well. We have been busy with the beginning of classes, faculty meetings, orientation (and many other beginning-of-school activities—so thankful to still be meeting in person!), several counseling sessions, hiking in the mountains as often as possible, daily chapel, volleyball games and suppers with students in our front yard, a couple of Zoom meetings with dear friends in Singapore (Peter and Pooifun Chin), our annual staff retreat for the Bear Valley International school coordinators, the BVBI Lectures, and we enjoyed visits from several family members (especially Turner!) I have been teaching a class called "Personal Spiritual Growth" for the Bear Valley women—which, for me, has been a great, thought-provoking, convicting study. I've also been sitting in on Denny Petrillo's Romans class on MWF
