In Book II, chapter 23 of Eusebius' Ecclesiastical History, the story is told about a man named James "the Just" (probably the brother of Jesus) who was known for his habit of going into the temple to pray. Eusebius said that James "was frequently found upon his knees begging forgiveness for the people, so that his knees became hard like those of a camel, in consequence of his constantly bending them in his worship of God, and asking forgiveness for the people." We might say today that James had camel knees.



As we look back over the last month it is easy to become excited about what God has been doing at Bear Valley Bible Institute and in the work of Bible Passages overall. During the month of January I was responsible for coordinating and facilitating each of the chapel sessions, and I have been teaching three accredited courses. On Monday, Wednesday, and Friday I teach a two hour course on church history. On Tuesday and Thursdays I teach nearly all day. For three hours in the morning I'm teaching the books of Thessalonians and Philippians. In the afternoon I'm teaching a course on Biblical Counseling. I have 24 students overall who hail from eight different states. It's been truly joyous to see them grow and develop in the faith.

We are also blessed to spend some quality time outside of class mentoring and counseling. Other endeavors this month have included my teaching a course on parenting at the Bear Valley congregation, counseling and providing advice over the phone for individuals and those in ministry. Our work continues on the Temple Project, and we have also been busy making preparations for the seven churches of Asia and journeys of Paul tour to be conducted for Bear Valley students, alumni, and friends this coming March. Brian Ketchem, who partners with us in our work, and Mat Cain from World Video Bible School will be participating in the tour and capturing video footage for use in future projects.

Overall the last month has been extremely busy for us, but we continue to hear good reports about those using Bible Passages' tools and resources. Thank you so much for all your love and support. Without you this work simply would not be possible.
