Bear Valley Alumnus Hard At Work:

One of the many blessings we receive in ministry is to hear about the hard work and various success stories of our former students. One of those students is Chris Carter (in the black shirt, center), who is now working full-time in the Lake Butler Church of Christ Prison Ministry in Florida. Chris has a fascinating story of his own, and we were privileged to become close to Chris while he was in school. He is now involved in a very exciting and profitable work both in the prison

ministry and in the community of Lake Butler. Reports about baptisms and the stories of changed lives has been phenomenal. This photo captures only a handful of men that their ministry impacts each day through counseling, encouragement, and teaching Bible. A part of their program also includes the use of materials from WVBS.

A Viewer in France: On our most recent filming trip and Bible Lands program to Israel, a man named Mark Nelsen (pictured right) recognized the Bible Land Passages logo being worn by colleague Mat Cain. Mark is a Baptist American missionary in France who happened to be participating in an archaeology dig in Israel. He is an incredibly nice and encouraging man, and we have continued to correspond. Here is a part of the first email he sent to us after our meeting in Capernaum: "As I was driving back to my place I called my wife. I said, 'You'll never guess who I met. You remember the video about Khirbet Qeiyafa and how much it encouraged us to love [our son-in-law] based on the OT principle of loving/caring for foreigners?' And John, that's all I could get out



and we both started bawling...My brother, you will never know how deep and important of an impact that video has had in our lives...Thank you again for your wonderful ministry. May God richly bless you, your wife and your entire team."

Marriage Enrichment and Counseling: From month to month, we can never anticipate some of the ways we are called to serve. While we are not licensed professional counselors, we do on occasions find ourselves providing a lot of marriage counseling. We don't always have the flexibility in our schedule, nor sometimes the expertise to provide the right type of counsel, but there are many times when God places in our paths opportunities to serve in this capacity. This summer has been one of those times as we spent numerous hours working with two different Christian couples. While I cannot go into any of the details in this newsletter, please know that we have seen God at work in helping struggling marriages and your support of our work as allowed us to provide this counsel, along with the ability to provide counseling resources and materials to these couples free of charge. Please pray for us, and especially these hurting families we are seeking to help.

Temple Project - Filming Expedition in Israel and Rome: During April and May we were blessed to take yet another step in working toward the completion of the "Temple Project". After writing the scripts for the five-part miniseries about the sacred temples of the Jews, we developed a plan to capture video footage of important sites and places in Israel and Rome relating to this project. The church in Dripping Springs was so kind to support Mat Cain, our videographer and good friend, enabling him to accompany us with our group of 42 on this Bible Lands Studies program. While we were guiding, Mat and his son Kasey were spending time filming. At various times I would break away from the group to record segments. Carla, Roy Greenway, and Brian Ketchem were also critical in assisting with this effort in several ways, one of which was in capturing numerous 360 video segments for congregations and individuals to use in virtual reality tours of the Bible lands. We are not sure of the release date, since much will depend on World Video Bible School's workload and ours.

Gospel Meetings – What Goes Around, Comes Around: Whenever my dad would witness something in my



relationship with my boys that he had experienced with me he would often say, "what goes around comes around." In other words, as the recipient of a blessing (or sometimes a consequence) you are often blessed to pass it along to others. In our last report we mentioned the blessing of preaching for a gospel meeting in Oak Grove Missouri

where Jack McNeil labors as the gospel preacher (I was blessed to baptize Jack many years ago, and also performed the wedding ceremony for he and wis wife Kathy.) A month later I was blessed to preach another series

of lessons in Jasper, Texas but this time it was at a congregation whose preacher baptized <u>me</u> back in 1981, and who performed the wedding ceremony for Carla and me. What goes around, comes around.. and that is true with the blessings from God. Many years ago, Don and Janie Prather invested their time and efforts to mentor me as I was growing up, and then served as counselors as Carla and I prepared for marriage. I was blessed by getting to spend a week with Jack and Kathy and to see the fruits of their good labor, and I pray Don and Janie were able to see that in us. Carla and I owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the Prathers for all that they have done to help us over the years, especially when we were young. Their investment in us at such a young age reminds us that the time we take with young couples and individuals we encounter today can bear fruit for the Lord both now and the future.
