Dear Friends and Supporters,

On October 30, 1991 the so-called "perfect storm" ravaged the New England and Canadian coasts. The clash of two major storm systems in the Atlantic produced 40 to 80-foot ocean waves and wind gusts of up to 90 mph. Ships and property were destroyed, and the loss of the fishing vessel with six souls aboard the Andrea Gail dominated the news on the east coast. Years later a book was written about those events, and a movie soon followed called *The Perfect Storm*. This unfathomable fury of nature had once again captured the attention of the nation and caused all of us to remember the strength of an ocean storm and just how fragile or lives can be. Some of you may have had encountered some storms in your life – financial ruin, the loss of a loved one, a relationship gone bad, the horrors of abuse, the dissolution of a family, a family crisis, church crisis, a world crisis etc. All of these concerns and events can shake us and threaten to sink our boat of faith. But unlike the Andrea Gail, which was lost at Sea, the child of God can rest in the confidence that we serve a God "who sits above the storm" and can deliver us to safety. Psalm 29 reveals this powerful message, and its beautiful words were those assigned to me for discussion at last month's preachers' workshop in San Marcos, Texas, called Focal Point.

As I preached from Psalm 29 concerning "The God Above the Storm", sitting in the audience that day was Sarah Pogue, a young lady who five months earlier worked to keep me alive by performing CPR on me. It was a vivid reminder of how fragile life can be, but also how God uses various people in our lives to preserve and strengthen us through the challenges of our own personal storms. We continue to stand amazed at how God uses individuals like you to partner with us in the doing the work of the Lord. Because of God working through you, we have been allowed to devote ourselves to the ministry. Carla and I can't even begin to tell you how thankful we are for all your prayers, love, and support.




