# 2026 BIBLE PASSAGES ITINERARY




March 19-April 1

-MARCH 19, Thursday: Depart US – Begin your journey to Israel, a land rich with biblical history and spiritual significance. Prepare to walk in the footsteps of prophets, kings, and Jesus Himself.

•MARCH 20, Friday: Arrive in Israel – Arrive in Tel Aviv and meet at the airport in Tel Aviv. If we arrive early we will visit Aphek, a strategic city where the Philistines defeated Israel and captured the Ark of the Covenant (1 Samuel 4). Alternatively, explore Joppa (Jaffa), the ancient port city where Jonah boarded a ship to flee from God's call (Jonah 1:3) and where Peter had a vision that opened the gospel to the Gentiles (Acts 10:9–16). Overnight in Tel Aviv.

-MARCH 21, Saturday: Shiloh, Samaria, Jacob's Well, Mt. Gerizim, Mount Ebal – Today we visit Shiloh, the spiritual center of Israel for 369 years and the resting place of the Ark of the Covenant (Joshua 18:1). Continue to Samaria (Sebastia), the capital of the northern kingdom of Israel, built by King Omri (1 Kings 16:24). Stop at Jacob's Well, where Jesus revealed His identity as the Messiah to the Samaritan woman (John 4:5–6). Conclude the day at Mt. Gerizim and Mt. Ebal, the mountains where Israel proclaimed blessings and curses as instructed by Moses (Deuteronomy 11:29). Overnight in Tel Aviv.



the first Gentile convert (Acts 10), and where Paul was imprisoned before his journey to Rome (Acts 23:23-35). Travel through the historic Valley of Jezreel and our way to Nazareth, the hometown of Jesus, visit the Nazareth CofC for worship, and reflect on the life and ministry of Jesus (Matthew 2:23). As time permits, we will also stop for photographs and a devotional at the base of Mount Carmel near the brook of Kishon. Overnight at the Sea of Galilee.

MARCH 23, Monday: Hazor, Dan, Caesarea 1 Philippi, Bashan – Explore Hazor, a major Canaanite city conquered by Joshua (Joshua 11:10). Visit Dan, the northernmost city of ancient Israel, where Jeroboam set up a golden calf, leading the people into idolatry (1 Kings 12:28-30). Con- faith (Matthew 11:21). Overnight at the Sea of Galilee. tinue to Caesarea Philippi, where Peter confessed Jesus as the Christ (Matthew 16:13-20), and see the remains of pagan temples that once dominated the area. Upon our return to the Galilee, travel through biblical Bashan where we will see Mount Hermon in the distance along with the region where Paul traveled on the road to Damascus. Overnight at the Sea of Galilee.

MARCH 24, Tuesday: Mt. Arbel, Boat Ride, Capernaum, Magdala, Chorazin - Climb Mt. Arbel for breathtaking views of the Sea of Galilee and the surrounding region. Take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, recalling Jesus calming the storm and walking on water (Mark 4:35-41, Matthew 14:22-33). Visit Capernaum, Jesus' ministry base, where He performed many miracles (Matthew 4:13). Explore Magdala, the hometown of Mary Magdalene, and see the remains of a first-century synagogue (Luke 8:2). Conclude the day at Chorazin, one of the cities Jesus rebuked for its lack of





# 2026 BIBLE LAND PASSAGES ITINERARY



-MARCH 25, Wednesday: Beit Shean, Qumran, Dead Sea – Visit Beit Shean, a major biblical city where the bodies of King Saul and his sons were displayed after their defeat by the Philistines (1 Samuel 31:10). Continue to Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered, offering invaluable insights into the Bible and ancient Jewish life. End the day at the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth, where you can float in its mineral-rich waters. Overnight at the Dead Sea.

MARCH 26, Thursday: Masada, Jericho – Ascend Masada, the fortress where Jewish rebels made their last stand against the Romans in 73 AD. Explore the ruins and reflect on their courage and sacrifice. Travel to Jericho, one of the oldest cities in the world, where the walls fell after Joshua and the Israelites marched around them (Joshua 6:20). From here we will visit the Wadi Qelt overlook, and then make one final stop for the day at Mount Scopus to receive a proper introduction to the beautiful city of Jerusalem. Overnight in the Old City of Jerusalem.

MARCH 27, Friday: Israel Archaeological Museum, Beth Shemesh, Elah Valley – Spend the morning at the Israel Archaeological Museum, home to artifacts that illuminate the biblical world. Here we will also spend time discussing the topography and history of Jerusalem as we examine in detail the magnificent outdoor model of first

century Jerusalem. In afternoon we travel to the **Shephelah** and visit **Beth Shemesh**, where the Ark of the Covenant returned after being captured by the Philistines (1 Samuel 6:12). Then it is on to the **Elah Valley**, the site of David's victory over Goliath (1 Samuel 17:2). Overnight in **Jerusalem**.

-MARCH 28, Saturday: Mt. of Olives, Church of All Nations, Via Dolorosa, Tower of David – Worship in the city where Jesus celebrated the Passover. Walk the Mt. of Olives, where Jesus ascended to heaven (Acts 1:9–12) and where He wept over Jerusalem (Luke 19:41). Visit the Church of All Nations, built over the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed before His arrest (Matthew 26:36–46). Walk the Via Dolorosa, the path Jesus took to the cross, and reflect on His sacrifice. See the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, the traditional site of the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. Conclude the day at the Tower of David Museum, which traces Jerusalem's history through the ages, and where Herod's kingly palace was located. Overnight in Jerusalem.

# MARCH 29, Sunday: Kotel, Great Bridge Tour, Davidson Archaeological Park, City of David –

Begin at the **Kotel** (Western Wall), the holiest site in Judaism, where you can pray and reflect. Take the **Great Bridge Tour** for a modern perspective of Jerusalem's history and architecture. Explore the **Davidson Archaeological Park**, which



showcases ruins from the Second Temple period along with the southern steps which some believe to be the place where 3,000 were baptized as recorded in Acts 2. Next, we visit the **City of David**, the original site of Jerusalem, where David established his capital (2 Samuel 5:7). Here we will also explore the ancient Canaanite underground water system and Hezekiah's tunnel. Our day will end with a devotional at the first-century **pool of Siloam** where Jesus told the blind man to wash and was healed (John 9). Overnight in **Jerusalem**.

-MARCH 30, Monday: Free Day – This will be a free day. Instruction will be given on how to visit other sites within the city. This will be a great day for shopping or visiting other places in the city such the traditional sites for the upper room, Caiaphas' House, and Oscar Schindler's grave. Other great sites to visit would be the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, the Eastern Gate, the Rampart Walk, the Temple Institute, Wohl Museum, and many other historically and culturally interesting and significant places. It will be a special day for individual adventure and exploration, or rest and relaxation. (Breakfast and Dinner Provided).

-MARCH 31, Tuesday: Garden Tomb, Free Time, Late Departure from Tel Aviv – Visit the Garden Tomb, a serene site which is an alternative site to the church of Holy Sepulcher and the site connected to Golgotha.

Spend free time reflecting, shopping, or exploring **Jerusalem** at your own pace. Depart late from **Tel Aviv**, carrying the memories of your journey.

-APRIL 1, Wednesday: Arrive US – Arrive back in the US, enriched by your experiences and the deep connections you've made to the biblical narrative.

## **PROGRAM DIRECTORS AND GUIDES**

She is the founder of the "Write On My Heart Every Word" scripture writing ministry, and is co-host of the weekly podcast "Looking Up! with Kathy and Carla." John and Carla are also the founders and film directors of the Bible Land Passages documentaries series, Connection videos, Bible Passages Podcast, and Land and Book, all available on several media platforms.

Agree to Polishing the Pulpit dress code and code of conduct. To maximize the travel and tour experience, and to keep costs affordable, a minimum and maximum number of passengers is set between 24 and 50. To ensure your place on this unique tour opportunity, please secure your reservation immediately by completing the registration form and making your deposit. Registration forms will be processed on a first-come, first served basis.

The basic cost for sharing a twin room is \$3,875 per person. Price is based on double occupancy and does NOT include

airfare. If you prefer single occupancy you will need to add the **\$1,350** supplement. Be certain to see Terms and Conditions.

# TERMS & CONDITIONS

Revised 4.17.25 – Terms and Conditions Included Below

**ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS:** To safeguard the security and intent of the Bible Land Tour program, unless otherwise stated, the following rules apply to be eligible for participation in a Bible Land Passage tour.

- You must be a member of a church or a close friend or relative of someone who is (references may be required).
- 2. You must be twelve years of age or older.
- 3. Those under the age of eighteen must be accompanied by an adult family member, legal guardian, or have special permission from the tour directors to attend. For a minor under the age of eighteen, in order to travel outside of the US without both parents or legal guardians, a notarized affidavit must be obtained and presented to airport or governmental officials upon departure and return.
- 4. You must have a valid passport not expiring within six months of departure date (for example, if your departure date leaving Israel after your tour is January 1, your passport must not expire before July 1 of that year.)
- 5. You must agree to the terms and conditions as outlined on the registration documents
- 6. You must agree to abide by the principles of conduct as outlined in the New Testament.
- 7. You must meet the health and physical disabilities criteria outlined below.
- 8. You must abide by the Polishing the Pulpit code of conduct and Dress Code.

**DEPOSITS AND RESERVATIONS:** To ensure your place on your desired tour, you must sign and complete the BP registration form, either online or via USPS mail, and make your \$300 per person non-refundable deposit. Payment options are listed below. All passengers must have a valid passport, and it must be valid for 6 months BEYOND RETURN TRAVEL DATE (see example in number four above).

**CLOTHING:** Polishing the Pulpit Modesty Rules: The PTP modesty standard includes no shorts (of any length); no low cut tops/dresses; no strapless/spaghetti strap tops; no tank tops; no tight/form fitting clothes such as stretch/yoga pants/tight jeans/tight dress pants; no skirts/dresses above

the knee (even when sitting); no midriffs; no other revealing/distracting clothing. The dress code does not apply to children 5-years-old and under. School-age and up are asked to honor it.

**COST:** The basic cost for sharing a twin room is \$3,875 per person. Price is based on double occupancy and does NOT include airfare. If you prefer single occupancy you will need to add the \$1,350.00 supplement. Please see www.biblepassages.net for terms, conditions, and expenses.

by check or credit card (with associated fees). A non-refundable deposit of \$300 per person is required to secure your reservation. Within 145 days of departure, 50% of payment is required and a supplement in airfare may apply. Balance of tour price is due upon receipt of final invoice, approximately 60 days prior to departure. To officially enroll, participants must sign the terms and conditions document and send to BLPT along with your \$300 deposit.

**PAYMENTS:** Payments and deposits (non-refundable) may be made by check or credit card, but to secure your place on the tour we highly recommend that your deposit be made via the online registration process (see appropriate tour link here: https://www.biblepassages.net/). For deposits and payments made using a credit card, processing fees of 3.9% will apply.






CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY: All cancellations must be received in writing. However, due to our already low costs, we will not have excess monies to meet our contractual agreement with the airlines European travel agencies if passengers cancel after reservations are secured. In the event an emergency arises and you must cancel your reservation, we will do our very best to refund as much of your money as possible. Bible Passages highly recommends travel and trip cancellation insurance. Airline tickets are non-refundable, and once final payment for the overall cost of the trip is processed it is extremely difficult to obtain even a partial refund from entities abroad. Cancellation penalty is as follows: 119-70 days before departure: 50% of the total price; 69-45 days before departure: 70% of the total package; Within 45 days of departure: 100% of the total (no refund available). Bible Passages

must follow this cancellation policy due to our own suppliers requiring payment from us, and our inability to regain those funds after payment.

**SPACE IS LIMITED.** To maximize the travel and tour experience, and to keep costs affordable, a minimum and maximum number of passengers is set between 25 and 50. If, for any reason, the number of registrants falls below the 25-participant threshold, BP tour directors are authorized to cancel the trip altogether if necessary. If, for any reason, a trip is canceled due to insufficient numbers, all deposits and payments will be refunded in full.

Registration forms will be processed on a first come, first served basis.

HOTELS AND ACCOMMODATIONS: Accommodations are



based on four Star Hotel standards of Israel with two persons sharing a twin-bedded room with private bathroom facilities. Since hotels charge per room, the tour price for rooms occupied by one person is higher than those where two or more persons share the cost. Single rooms are available at a supplemental charge.

to place with land transportation, we need to limit our packing to one medium size suitcase per person, and one small carry-on and/or backpack (or if you are a Rick Steves fan, then limit all your luggage to just one carry-on and backpack). Baggage handling for one standard size suitcase per person is included in the price. Due to limited motor coach capacity, this bag should have dimensions not exceeding 62 linear inches (length + width + height; including wheels and handles) and weight not exceeding 50 lbs. Carry-on bags are the responsibility of the passengers. One carry-on and one personal item are allowed. Dimensions for carry-on bags are not to exceed 9" X 14" X 22" inches.
